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Introduction to Poster Presentations

- Poster = visual medium
- Poster objective = communication
- Posters are advertisements of research, scholarship, etc.
 - More than providing information or a conversation starter
 - Should be visually attractive / appealing from a distance
- Key ingredient = preparation (for poster and presentation)
- Limitation is important (i.e., less is more)
 - Important to have a clear message
- Enjoy the presentation
 - Enthusiastic presenter \rightarrow enthusiastic audience

Preparation for Poster Presentations

- Know who is in the audience
 - What do they already know?
 - What would they be interested to learn?
- Determine the take-away point of the poster and presentation
 - What do you want the audience to remember?
- Prepare talking points (not a fixed script) for a short presentation
 - Prepare for a broad audience and interruptions
 - Time your presentation when you practice
- Check that your poster is easily readable
 - Print out scaled to Letter size to check readability
- Show your poster to others and practice your presentation
 - Ask for feedback on all aspects of the poster and presentation
 - Include a round of questions while practicing your presentation

Poster Content & Structure

- Title, authors and affiliations
 - Include logo(s) and possibly author picture
- Context / motivation
 - Can include some references
- Methodology / framework
 - Can include some references
- Results / findings (can be preliminary / anticipated)
- Discussion (can include future work for you or the field)
- Conclusions
- Acknowledgements & reference list
 - Can be in smaller font
- Do not include the submitted abstract on the poster

Poster Technicalities

- Poster creation options: Powerpoint, Google Slides, Canva, etc.
 - Can use GW or another template, or create your own
 - Start with the appropriate dimensions (e.g., 4x3 or 3x4 feet)
- Start by sketching a design / lay-out
 - Think about all main design and content elements
- Aim for a balance between text and visuals
 - Use bullet points instead of paragraphs
 - Consider diagrams to describe processes, relationships, etc.
- Everything should support the message
 - Need to explain figures, tables, etc.
 - Effective poster figures may differ from figures in papers
- Think carefully about color schemes & backgrounds
 - Keep color blindness in mind

Poster Presentation

- Speak clearly, slowly, with variation & articulation
 - Be aware of non-native speakers in the audience
- Show enthusiasm & confidence
- Strong position & posture
- Make eye contact with audience
- Use visuals to your advantage
- Listen carefully to questions being asked
 - It is ok not to know the answer to every question
- Practice, practice!
