JD Concentration in Government Procurement Law AY 2023-2024

Concentration Overview

JD candidates may earn recognition of a JD Concentration in Government Procurement Law by taking a minimum of 12 credits of government procurement courses after completion of the required first-year curriculum. The 12-credit requirement consists of:

- LAW 6502 Formation of Government Contracts (3 credits);
- LAW 6503 Performance of Government Contracts (3 credits);
- Two credits of experiential learning from a government procurement-related "Field Placement" (LAW 6668) or any government procurement course that is designated as an "E" or "Skills/E" course per the Law School Bulletin. The Associate Dean for Government Procurement Law will review requests to use a government-procurement-related Field Placement to satisfy this requirement.
- A research paper that meets the standards for the law school's legal writing requirement (e.g., at least 8,000 words), either written in conjunction with a two-credit government contract research paper course, or, with the approval of the Associate Dean for Government Procurement Law, written for a journal, independent legal writing, or a course on a government procurement law topic. Please note that if you are a member of the Public Contract Law Journal (PCLJ), only two (2) credits count toward the Concentration requirements for LAW 6657 Scholarly Writing.
- At least 2 elective credits from courses listed under the JD Concentration Checklist below.

To apply for a JD Concentration in Government Procurement Law, students must submit an <u>Application for JD Concentration in Government Procurement</u>. Preferably, students should submit the application by the end of their second year but no later than their last semester of their program.

Students are not allowed to apply for more than one JD concentration at GW Law. Those applying for a concentration in Government Procurement Law must certify in their application that they are not applying for other concentrations.
